FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

2022 marks Kiran's 24th year as an organization dedicated to ending the cycle of abuse and serving and empowering South Asian people experiencing domestic violence. We approach this mission by providing culturally and gender competent support to our clients. Over the years, we have helped increasing numbers of North Carolina's South Asian population out of their abusive situations.

When the pandemic started, our services became increasingly important. People were confined in their homes with more exposure to their abusers, and we had to work through the barriers posed by the pandemic to provide our clients with the services they needed. Throughout 2021, we worked our way into normalcy, slowly opening our office back up. 2022 was the first time in two years that we were fully able to provide in-person services to our clients. This year, we actively served 154 clients and answered over 2140 crisis calls.

We also had numerous successful outreach efforts this year. In the triangle area, our annual events, the Kiran Bazaar and the Heroes for Hope Walkathon, were hugely impactful. Our Kiran Charlotte team organized Maya: The Rising, a dance recital to fundraise for Kiran. We are indebted to the Charlotte community for their support in making this event a huge success. We are greatly appreciative of our volunteers who tirelessly work to help us engage with our community.

What we do would not be possible without the support of our funders and donors. As we worked fully in-person this year, their contributions allowed us the flexibility to bolster our organization in the ways we needed. The connections we have with partner agencies, law enforcement, local officials, and community members are also incredibly integral to our work.



Finally, we would like to thank our Board of Directors, Advisory Committee, and staff for their dedication to supporting our clients this year. The Kiran team is filled with impassioned individuals who are dedicated to fulfilling our cause.

I thank you for your support in our quest to light the path to hope in 2022, and in 2023, we look forward to building upon that momentum. The Kiran team will continue to engage in this work to make domestic violence an issue of the past.

ORIGIN STORY

HOW WE CAME TO BE

Kiran was conceptualized in 1998 in response to domestic violence cases within the South Asian community.

By 2000, the agency was incorporated by several community members as a volunteer-run organization intended to serve the Triangle Region. In 2008, more community members came together to formalize Kiran's operations by forming the Executive Board and applying for Kiran's first federal grant as part of the new VAWA Communities of Color provisions. This allowed the agency to serve all of North Carolina. With this grant Kiran became, and still is, the only federally funded 501(c)3 nonprofit organization in NC providing critical culturally specific services to the state's significant and growing South Asian population.



SERVICES

AID AND PREVENTION

CLIENT AID

Client services are administered to individuals actively working with Kiran. All services are provided keeping in mind the nuances of South Asian culture.

- 24/7 crisis line
- Intensive case management
- Personalized safety planning
- Legal advocacy
- Mental health referrals
- Medical referrals
- Housing referrals
- Transportation assistance
- Translation and interpretation assistance for dozens of South Asian languages, as spoken by staff members and volunteers

- Driving lessons/Vehicle ownership

PREVENTION AND AWARENESS

Prevention happens through public and private community outreach in every capacity. Awareness helps the community be aware of the culturally specific services Kiran provides and also some factors of domestic violence unique to South Asians. Here's a list of ways Kiran provides prevention and awareness to the community:

- Cultural sensitivity training for law enforcement and other mainstream DV agencies

CLIENT STORIES

One client came to us 2-3 years ago after enduring physical, emotional, and verbal abuse from her husband. The abuse started immediately after they moved to the US, the client on a conditional green card. Kiran connected this client with immigration attorneys to remove the conditions from her green card and supported her with legal fees and living expenses. Kiran has provided this client with crisis counseling, support filling out paperwork and applying for benefits. Her conditions were removed from her green card in July 2022, she started a new job in her chosen industry, her divorce is final, and the settlement is helping her build a new life for herself.

Another client first contacted Kiran in 2019. She had gone through serious emotional and physical abuse from her husband and inlaws. Kiran helped her file for a DVPO and provided attorney support for her family court cases. Kiran also helped her with her living expenses while her case was ongoing. To help her with her new life, Kiran provided her with a laptop so she could finish her Master's degree and helped pay for trainings and certifications that would help her with her job placement. She has also filed for her immigration visa and Kiran has helped her financially with the associated attorney fees and medical tests. As she continues on her journey to become independent, Kiran is supporting her in all the ways possible.

One client moved to the United States on a fiancee visa and began experiencing verbal and emotional abuse just a few days after her marriage. The abuse escalated to include sexual and physical abuse. The client wanted to return to India but her family discouraged her from returning and told her to work it out. With no support from her family, she reached out to Kiran. We helped her file a DVPO against her spouse and also a VAWA petition. Since she did not have a work authorization, Kiran has provided assistance with rent and groceries. Kiran is continuously supporting and encouraging this client so that she is ready to join the work force and grow into an independent and strong woman.


stayed at a similar rate as 2020 since many victims are still in close proximity to their abusers due to pandemic restrictions.





THIS YEAR

2022 marked a full time return to the office for Kiran staff and serving walk-in clients, while adhering to healthcare guidelines for in person gatherings. We held many more in-person outreach and fundraising events in the community.

As client care is our primary function, the bulk of our donations and fundraising are geared towards elevating client services. The distribution in our categories (as seen on the previous page) have shifted during this year based on our clients' presenting requirements for assistance.

We held 3 large community fundraising and outreach events in 2022. Our Charlotte team organized a dance recital fundraiser called Maya: The Rising. We had our major annual fundraiser - Heroes for Hope Walkathon at Lake Crabtree. We also were able to host our first Kiran Bazaar since the pandemic.

We conducted several cultural sensitivity trainings, youth and teen events, connected with student groups at local organizations, and added more volunteers to our team.




